Message from your OCTA President - Carrie Patane

Every day, we show up for students who are navigating a world that feels heavier than it once did. Families are working harder to afford basic necessities; young people entering adulthood often feel unsure about

their future; and many of us sense that the idea of each generation doing better than the last isn't as certain as it used to be.



These challenges don't exist somewhere "out there." They're present in our classrooms, in the stories students carry with them, and in the quiet conversations we have with parents in hallways and parking lots. They remind us that schools are not just places of learning — they are anchors of stability, hope, and community. And when our schools work well, when they are focused, safe, and supportive, students thrive.

We are already seeing what is possible when we act together for the well-being of children. The new <u>bell-to-bell cellphone policy</u> is a powerful example. According to the recent statewide educator survey: Nearly 90% of educators report <u>positive changes</u> and

More than 75% see students engaging more with each other. Over half report increased academic participation while most educators say they now spend more time teaching and less time redirecting. But as with any real change, all of this progress starts in the elementary classrooms - the talk, the guidance, and the discussion from pre-K - sixth grade, our elementary teachers lay the groundwork for any change we wish to make in our district, and so it goes with the cell phone policy. A change this immediate and long-lasting only comes about with the support and enforcement of all. We educate our students about content, but learning appropriate social behaviors, how to interact face to face with others, and maintaining a focus on educationally rich opportunities is a win-win for educators, our students, our community, and our future..

This is what happens when we work collectively for what is best for students — not for convenience, not for optics, but for genuine growth and learning. And yet, we know our work is far from done. Many students still carry stress tied to financial insecurity, family pressures, or uncertainty about the future. Improving focus in school is only one piece of helping them build meaningful, stable lives. Our role as educators has always been larger than content delivery — we nurture resilience, curiosity, empathy, and possibility.

So we will continue to show up with patience, skill, and determination. We will continue to advocate for learning environments where children can flourish. We will continue to look out for one another — because the work is hard, and none of us should have to do it alone.

Our strength has always come from our shared commitment: to students, to each other, and to the communities we serve. Thank you for the work you do — the visible work and the invisible work. Thank you for believing in young people even when the world feels uncertain. Thank you for being the steady place our students return to, day after day. And of course, thank you for being an important part of our union!

We are excited to welcome **Alecia Ascenzi** to Oswego Middle School! A native of Oswego,



The most recent data reports
that there are over 154,000
unhoused students in New York
City. For many of our school
communities, this means
educating a transient
population — students who
may arrive at school unfed,
underslept, inadequately

dressed, and dealing with the trauma that goes with being unhoused.

One in five children live in poverty in New York, and that stat is front of mind for teachers at PS 399 Stanley Eugene Clark in Brooklyn. Fortunately, PS 399 is part of UFT's United Community Schools, a network of 39 community schools that work to ensure students' basic needs are met, so they are able to learn.

Vote Cope -






