Message from your OCTA President - Carrie Patane



As you know, the OCTA is purchasing the <u>Legal Assistance Plan</u> for all of our members this year. Included in this plan are a FREE Will, Healthcare Proxy, Power of Attorney, and Living Will. Even if you already have a will we encourage you to take advantage of this benefit and update it. Each member can share this benefit with 2 family members including children 26 and under, a spouse, parents, grandparents, or in-laws! Note: Any additional set above the 3 sets is \$100 per set. There is an additional \$50 fee per will if the member would like to add a Minors Trust (to hold the children's inheritance longer than 18). The minors trust is optional.

Any member who scheduled an appointment to meet with a member of the Feldman, Kramer, & Monaco legal team via ZOOM please remember to be available on your scheduled day and time. A lawyer should be sending info through email soon for those who signed up for Nov 7,8,15.

The only openings that remain on the schedule are on Nov 22nd! Sign-up using the Parent Square post. Don't forget to include your email address and phone number in a note so your lawyer can send you a zoom invite.

IMPORTANT: You must fill out AS MUCH of this <u>questionnaire</u> as possible <u>before</u> your appointment so the lawyer can go over what you have already answered, answer any questions you may have, advise you on your decisions, and ultimately tell you where to send the completed questionnaire so that it can be drawn up at the office and prepared for your signature.

What's next: We will be planning WILL DAYS in the Spring, at which time the lawyers will come to our buildings to notarize all of the completed documents and obtain any necessary signatures. Any other questions please feel free to contact FK&M:

New York State Teachers' Retirement System (NYSTRS) Benefits Presentation (presented by OCTA)



the student if they move to another school within the district and so staff can see the note too.

Longevity- At the start of a member's 11th, 16th, 21st, 26th, and 31st years of credited teaching service in the New York State Teachers' Retirement System (NYSTRS), teachers (excluding TAs) are eligible to receive a longevity salary credit for the designated school years. These credits will become a permanent part of their annual salary.

Credited teaching service will be verified by the New York State Teachers' Retirement System Annual Statement. Please send a copy of your statement to Rachel Enos at **renos@oswego.org**. You only need to send this statement the first time you qualify for longevity.

Employee Assistance Program (EAP): To contact them call 315-470-7447.)

The district provides members with services to help with stress management, family stress, anxiety and panic, workplace issues, communication barriers and more. The service is provided by Help People. It is a free and confidential service! Offices are located in Fulton, Liverpool and Syracuse.

Transportation of Students is prohibited

Personal cars of teachers and staff shall not be used to transport students except in the event of extenuating circumstances and authorized by the administration. (<u>Board Policy 5720</u>.)



Health Insurance: If you are having difficulties with Aetna be sure to reach out to Assured Partners (was ENV) at (315) 641-5848. They can help you with Benefit questions, claims issues, finding providers, etc. You should also inform Amanda Hamilton at the EDC and Carrie Patane of claim issues so they can pass the information on to the members of the Healthcare Committee. IF you have reached out to Assured Partners and you still have concerns, please let us know that too. Make sure you are using Teledoc and Express Scripts when possible to

help reduce plan costs and to lower our premiums.

If you would like to order free COVID-19 tests, please visit <u>COVID.gov</u>. Please note that since we are self-insured, ordering tests from Express Scripts impacts our prescription drug plan and will add to the district's healthcare expenses for the year. Any expenses incurred impact our premiums!




