Nine years without a contract

Despite that, Lawrence local perseveres

When your cause is just, you persevere — no matter how long it takes. For the roughly 300 members of the Lawrence Teachers Association on Long Island, "persevering" has meant working without a contract for the past nine years. Bogged down by a school board demanding draconian givebacks — including eliminating class size limits, requiring all secondary teachers to teach six classes instead of

five, and having new hires make 20 percent less — the local has been forced to find new ways to get the board's attention.

This fall the LTA launched a campaign of twice daily picketing outside the homes of the district's seven school board members carrying placards that proclaim, in English and Spanish, "no contract for nine years, still working" and "invest in public education." Board members have been relatively quiet, although they did call the police. "One of the officers was a former student of one of our elementary teachers," said Lori Skonberg, LTA president. "He gave her a hug."

If you couldn't make it to Saratoga, here's a recap:


- Delegates unanimously elected teachers <u>Sheila Sullivan Buck</u> and <u>Elizabeth Chetney</u> to the Retirement Board. Buck, of Rush-Henrietta Central Schools, was re-elected to a new three-year term as one of the three active teacher members on the Board. Chetney, of Baldwinsville Central School District, was elected to complete the term of Paul J. Farfaglia, who retired from teaching in June.
- A variety of seminars were offered, with topics ranging from the role of the delegate to the long-term stability of the System.
- Delegates took part in a question-and-answer period with the NYSTRS Board and staff.

WHAT IS VOTE-COPE?

Your statewide union has a political fund-raising arm called VOTE-COPE. VOTE-COPE is NYSUT's non-partisan action fund that coordinates the voluntary contributions of members and supports NYSUT-endorsed candidates and campaign committees that are pro-public-education and pro-labor.


No NYSUT dues dollars are used to support candidates or campaign committees.

NYSUT sends rebates to local unions based on a percentage (up to 40 percent) of the contributions VOTE-COPE receives from that local union's members. Those rebates can be used in local activities such as school board races and for passage of school budgets.

Jenn Cahill, OCTA's Vote-Cope coordinator, kicked off this year's campaign with Presidents & Vice Presidents earlier this month at the OCTA meeting.






