NYSTRS Seminar Well-Attended



On Tuesday, NOVEMBER 19, over 30 OCTA members were able to listen to a representative from the New York State Teachers Retirement System explain key retirement topics including:

how to be sure you receive all the service credit for which you are eligible, important service milestones and their impact on your pension calculation, the various pension payment options, death benefits and their continuation into retirement, and the steps to take to file for retirement.



If you were unable to attend the seminar, specific questions concerning your individual retirement situation should be discussed during an individual benefits consultation or by calling the Retirement System at (800) 348-7298.

The OCTA hosts two benefit seminars per year, the next one will take place in March 2025. Look for information in the February Advocate!

Health Care: St. Joseph's Hospital has indicated that if they don't reach an agreement with Aetna they will be dropped from their network as of January 1st, 2025. You will still be able to visit a Dr. through St. Joseph's, but they will be considered out of network. St. Joseph's and Aetna are negotiating, however, this may not be settled before January 1, 2025. If you have a provider at St.

Joseph's and do not want to pay out of network costs, you may need to begin looking for a new provider.

Health Insurance: If you are having difficulties with Aetna be sure to reach out to Assured Partners (was ENV) at (315) 641-5848. They can help you with Benefit questions, claims issues, finding providers, etc. You should also inform Amanda Hamilton at the EDC and Carrie Patane of claim issues so they can pass the information on to the members of the Healthcare Committee. IF you have reached out to Assured Partners and you still have concerns, please let us know that too. Make sure you are using Teladoc and Express Scripts when possible to help reduce plan costs and to lower our premiums.



Negotiations: We are continuing to negotiate on your behalf. We have moved from small team meetings to one on one negotiations between Dr. Kilmer and Carrie Patane.


